DVD PictureShow for Mac Update Patch (Released Date: 2003/12/31)

This patch fixes the following problems that occur in the Mac OS X 10.3 (Panther)

1. Cannot burn disc.
2. Background music in the WAV format causes errors when burning.

Q: I am having Roxio Toast 6 installed in the machine. Is it possible that I can use Toast 6 to burn the disc image file, which was created by DVD PictureShow?

A: Yes.

First of all, you need to create a disc image file (*.VCD) that can be burned using Roxio Toast 6. Here are the steps:

1. Open your DVD PictureShow project.

2. Choose DVD PictureShow \ Preferences menu command and enable "Create compatible disc image format (Video VD)"
3. Switch to burn step.
4. Set output options:
Only enable "Create disc image file" setting.
5. Press Create button to create a VCD disc image file. (*.VCD)

Next, burn your disc image file (*.VCD) using Roxio Toast 6 via the following steps:

1. Go to Roxio Toast 6 Main Window.
2. Click "Copy tab".
3. Click "Disc Settings" button.
4. Set setting to "Image File", and then click the "select" button in "Content Area".
5. Choose *.vcd image file which is created by DVD PictureShow 1.
6. Then press "Record disc" button to burn to a disc.

Q: How do I make both the slideshow and background music to be synchronous?

A: When you prepare the music clip for your slideshow, you can see the program has a place to let us set the duration for each slide. The default duration is 3 seconds. So, when deciding the music length you can just sum up the total duration of the photos. For example, for a slideshow with 10 photos with a default duration of 3 secs each, the calculating figure of the required length should be $10 \times 3 = 30$ seconds.

Even though the preview may sometimes show a little difference, please don't forget it is a preview, and the final burning result should be fine, you may ignore it at that time.
